

Before you begin

The shut-down instruction varies depending on the operating system installed on your computer.

- Windows 10: Click Start → **②** Power → Shut down.
- Windows 8.1: On the **Start** screen, Click the power icon $\mathbf{0} \rightarrow \mathbf{Shut}$ down.
- Windows 7: Click Start → Shut down.



- **3** Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables and network cables, from your computer.
- **5** Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor, from your computer.
- **6** Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 7 Close the display and turn the computer over.


Removing the base cover









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Prerequisites

- 2 Using a plastic scribe, gently release the tabs that secure the keyboard to the palm-rest assembly.




Carefully turn the keyboard over and place it on the palm-rest assembly.





Open the latches and disconnect the keyboard cable and the keyboard-backlight cable from the system board.

Replacing the keyboard

- 2 Carefully turn the keyboard over, slide the tabs on the keyboard into the slots on the palm rest, and snap the keyboard into place.

NOTE: Replacing the system board removes any changes you have made to the BIOS using the BIOS setup program. You must make the appropriate changes again after you replace the system board.

Removing the heat sink



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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.




