Safety

Ensure that your domestic mains supply voltage matches the voltage indicated on the identification sticker located at the back of your set. Where the mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as disconnect device, it shall remain readily operable. On certain models, the light indicator is located at the side of the TV set. The absence of a light indication at the front does not mean that the TV set is fully disconnected from the mains. To disconnect the TV set completely, the mains plug must be pulled out. The TV set's components are sensitive to heat. The maximum ambient temperature should not exceed 35° Celsius. Do not cover the vents at the back or sides of the TV set. Leave sufficient space around it to allow adequate ventilation. Install the appliance away from any source of heat (fireplace, etc.) or appliances creating strong magnetic or electric fields. Moisture in rooms where the set is installed should not exceed 80% humidity. Moving the set from a cold place to a warm one can cause condensation on the screen (and on some components inside the TV set). Let the condensation evaporate before switching the TV set on again.

WARNINGS

This appliance is intended for domestic household use only and should not be used for any other application, such as for non-domestic use or in a commercial environment.

If the external flexible cable or cord of this product is damaged, it shall be replaced by the manufacturer or his service agent or a similar qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.

Leave more than 10cm clearance around the television to allow adequate ventilation. The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspapers, table-cloths, curtains, etc.

The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases shall be placed on the apparatus.

Batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

If you are **not going** to **be watching the TV for a lengthy period of time**, switch it off completely by removing the plug from the mains power socket.

During **thunderstorms**, we recommend that you disconnect the TV set from the mains and aerial so that it is not affected by electrical or electromagnetic surges that could damage it. For this reason, keep the **mains and aerial sockets** accessible so they can be **disconnected**, if necessary.

Unplug the TV set immediately if you notice it giving off a **smell of burning** or **smoke**. You must never, under any circumstances, open the TV set yourself, as you run the risk of an **electric shock** in doing so.

TV screen

The TV screen used in this product is made of glass. Therefore, it can break when the product is dropped or impacted upon by other objects.

The TV screen is a very high technology product, giving you finely detailed pictures. Occasionally, a few nonactive pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed point of blue, green or red. This does not affect the performance of your product.

Care

Use a glass-cleaning product to clean the screen and a soft cloth and mild detergent to clean the rest of the set.

Important: Using strong detergents, alcohol-based and abrasive products may damage the screen. Dust the vents at the back and sides regularly. Using solvents, abrasive or alcohol-based products could damage the TV set. If an object or liquid enters the appliance, unplug it immediately and have it checked by an authorized engineer. Never open the appliance yourself since this may put you at risk or damage the appliance.

Hanging the TV set on the wall Warning: This operation requires two people.

To ensure a safe installation, observe the following safety notes:

- Check that the wall can support the weight of the TV set and wall mount assembly.

To avoid TV from falling please fasten TV to the wall by using necessary screws (in Vesa wall mount holes), clamps, anchors to be bought separately. Install TV near to the wall to avoid falling backwards.

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





Switch the TV on and off

- 1. When the power cord is connected, the TV will be turned on directly or be in standby mode. If the TV is in standby mode, press the \circlearrowleft or **POWER**/ \circlearrowleft button on the set or the \circlearrowleft button on the remote control to turn it on.
- 2. To put the TV into standby mode, press the \circlearrowleft or **POWER**/ \circlearrowleft button on the set or the \circlearrowleft button on the remote control. The TV set remains powered up, but with low energy consumption.
- 3. To switch the TV off, unplug the mains plug from the mains outlet.

(*On certain models, you have to turn on the power switch first.)

Initial setup

Initial setup involves selecting all the settings required to be able to search for and store all the analogue and digital channels you can receive.

Make sure that the television is switched on and follow all the steps in turn specified hereafter.

Note: If the channel search retrieved only the analogue channels it could be caused by poor broadcasting and therefore is not covered by manufacturer warranty. Manufacturers cannot be held responsible for lack of or poor broadcasting in some areas.

The first time you switch the set on, the **Initial Setup** wizard opens, which guides you through the initial setup process. (Refer to Figure 1.)

Step 1: Environment setup

Note: If you select France or Italy, you will have to enter the password setting menu here to set a password. Use the numeric buttons to enter a four-digit number as your password. (0000 is too simple to be set as your password.) Enter the same code again to confirm the password. After that, you will enter the next step automatically. (In this step, you can only press & to return to the previous step.)

Step 2: Network setup

- Press to select your network connection type (Wired or Wireless), then press OK/> to enter the next step.
- Follow the guides on the screen and press the corresponding buttons on the remote control to proceed.

Note: You can also skip this step and step 3
by selecting "I do not have a network
connection", and connect to the Internet later.
For details please refer to section Network
Connection.

Step 3: Software update

- If the set has connected to the network successfully, it will search for upgrade files automatically.
- Follow the guides on the screen and press the corresponding buttons on the remote control to proceed.

Step 4: Channel installation

- Follow the guides on the screen and press the corresponding buttons on the remote control to proceed.

Note: To prevent the channel installation process from being interrupted, wait for the message indicating that the installation is complete. You can also skip this step by selecting "I don't want to install channels". In this case, to search and store your channels you may do an automatic channel search by following the instructions in the next section Performing an automatic channel search.

Step 5: Clock setup

- Press to select your time acquisition mode (Auto or Manual).
- If you have selected Manual, use the numeric buttons to enter the date and time, then select the OK button and press OK to confirm.

Step 6: Congratulations

The **Congratulations!** message appears. Press **OK** to confirm.

Performing an automatic channel search

This section describes how to search and store channels automatically. This may be done in any of the cases below:

- you have selected "I don't want to install channels" in the initial setup:
- you see "No program info now, please search channels first!" in TV mode;
- you want to update your channels.
- In TV mode, press MENU or OPTION on the remote control and select Settings > Channel > Channel scan. Press OK/

 to enter.
- 2. The TV installs and arranges channels according to your country. Press to select Country, and press OK/

 to enter. Enter the default password 1234 or your own password in case you have changed the password in the System > Lock menu. Press to select your country and press OK/

 to confirm.

(Note: **Satellite** option is available only in selected models.)

- 4. Follow a), b) or c) below.
 - a) If you have selected Cable.

 - Press to select Channel type.
 - If you select Digital & Analogue, press OK to enter. Press to select your Scan mode if available (Full or Advanced).
 - If you select Full, press to select the Search button and press OK to start the automatic search for all DVB-C digital and/or analogue channels.
 - If you select Advanced, use the numeric buttons to adjust the values for Frequency, Symbol rate, Network ID, and use
 ★ to select the Modulation mode. Then press
 ★ to select the Search button and press OK to start the automatic search for all DVB-C digital and/or analogue channels.
 - If you select **Digital**, follow the same process as above to start your automatic search for all DVB-C digital channels.
 - If you select Analogue, press OK to start your automatic search for all analogue channels.
 - b) If you have selected Antenna.
 - c) If you have selected Satellite.
- The channel search may take a few minutes. During the process, you can press OK to stop the search halfway.
- 6. After the automatic search, channels are arranged in a preset order. If you wish to skip channels, modify the preset order, rename or delete channels, press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Channel > Organiser and press OK/

 to enter.

Accessing channels

Using the numeric buttons: press the corresponding numeric buttons on the remote control to access the channels.

Using the PA/Y buttons: press the **PA/Y** buttons on the remote control or the corresponding buttons on the TV set to scroll through the channels.

Watching connected devices

Repeatedly press **SOURCE** on the remote control or **OK** on the TV set to toggle between TV and other input sources. Press **PA/v** to cycle through all TV channels and other input sources.

Note: Not all models have **OK** button on the set

Volume

Volume control: press the **V+/-** buttons on the remote control or the corresponding buttons on the TV set to increase or decrease the volume.

Sound mute: press the **⋈** button to temporarily mute the sound. Press this button again or the **V+** button to restore the sound.

Using TV menus

- Press MENU on the remote control to display the homepage.



Setting up your favourite channels

You can create a list of your favourite TV channels.

- Press the red button to enter Select channel list, select Favorites and press OK to enter.

Energy saving

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Picture > ECO settings > Energy saving and press OK/>> to enter.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Local dimming

(* available only in selected models)

Your TV is equipped with local dimming technology which increases local contrast and decreases power consumption.

Follow the steps below to access the local dimming.

- Press to select On or Off and press OK to confirm.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Viewing TV using the 3D function

(* not available for some models)

WARNING:

- Some viewers may experience discomfort while viewing 3D TV such as dizziness, nausea and headaches. If you experience any such symptom, stop viewing 3D TV, remove your 3D glasses and rest.
- Watching 3D videos too closely or for a long period of time may harm your eyesight.
- A responsible adult should frequently check on children who are using the 3D function.
- Do not use the 3D glasses for any other purpose than viewing 3D videos on a 3D TV.
- Do not use the 3D function or 3D glasses while walking or moving around, otherwise this may result

 - 3D-to-2D: Select On to display 3D image in 2D mode (no 3D effect).
 - L-R switch: Select On or Off to adjust the 3D video between the left and right eyes for better 3D viewing.
 - Depth of field: This option is available only in 3D mode. You can adjust it to achieve a good 3D effect with the image.
- Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu. Notes:
 - 3D glasses from other manufacturers may not be supported.
 - All photo functions are disabled in 3D mode.
 - If you change to a different signal source or access Smart TV, the 3D mode will be automatically disabled.
 - Some 3D modes may not be available depending on the input format of the 3D video source.
 - Supported 3D modes: Analogue TV, AV: 2D-to-3D Digital TV, CMP, HDMI, USB, Videos from the Internet: 2D-to-3D, Side-by-Side, Top-and-Bottom, Line interleave.
 - 3D function in USB mode: During the playback of a selected video from USB, press OPTION to display the video menu in the browser mode, then select 3D mode. For more detail information, refer to the above related descriptions.

SPDIF type

Connect the TV to an audio device through the SPDIF output. To select a proper sound type for your SPDIF output, press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Sound > SPDIF type and press OK

to enter. Press

to select an option and press OK to confirm.

- If you select Auto, the SPDIF output format is
- Dolby Digital when the programme's sound format is Dolby Digital or Dolby Digital Plus or HE-AAC.
- PCM when the programme's sound format is MPEG.
- If you select PCM, the SPDIF output format is PCM, regardless of the programme's sound format.

- If you select **Off**, this turns off the audio output from the audio device connected to the SPDIF output.

Note: The options you may choose depend on the programme you are watching. If the sound is ahead of the picture, you can select **SPDIF**delay from the **Sound** menu, press **OK**/

then press **S**/**>** to adjust the delay time to synchronize the sound with the picture.

Audio description

Audio description refers to an additional narration track for blind and visually impaired viewers of visual media, including television programmes and movies.

The description narrator talks through the presentation describing what is happening on the screen during the natural pauses in the audio (and during dialogue if deemed necessary).

You can use this feature if the current broadcast contains audio description.

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Sound > Advanced settings > Audio description and press OK/

 to enter.

- 4. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Diagnostics on digital TV channels

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control and select Settings > Channel > Channel diagnostics.
- Press OK/
 to display some signal information on the current digital channel, such as signal strength, frequency, etc.
- 3. Press OK to confirm.
- 4. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Timeshift

Allows you to record digital TV programmes so that you will not miss the favourite part even if you go out. Before you use the function, connect a USB drive to the TV first. For the first time, you should do the disk setup for the USB drive.

Note: This feature is available only in selected products and, due to specific TV network limitations and country technical requirements, might not be available in product or place of installation. This feature might also be blocked by TV network due to copyright protection (HD content, recording protection). Please press OPTION on the

- remote control to check if this feature is available in your product.
- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Channel > Timeshift and press OK/>> to enter.
- Press to select On and press OK to switch on the timeshift function, then press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.
- **3.** Press **OPTION** on the remote control and select **Timeshift**, then press **OK** to confirm.
- Follow the directions on the screen to do the disk setup.
- After the disk setup is done, press OPTION and select Timeshift.
- 6. Press **OK** to display the timeshift menu.
 - Press the II button to pause the picture and begin the timeshift.
 - Press the ▶ button to play the recorded part.
 - Press the

 dutton to fast backward or the
 button to fast forward.
 - When the timeshift menu disappears and only the timing of the timeshift remains on the screen, you can press **IV**►/**◄♦**► to access the timeshift menu.
 - Press the button to quit the timeshift function.

Notes:

- Before you connect the USB drive to the TV, make sure you have backed up the data in the drive to avoid the loss of your important data due to unforeseen malfunction.
- We recommend you use a USB drive with free capacity above 1GB and disk speed faster than 5.0MB/sec.
- The bigger the USB drive free memory for timeshift, the bigger the recording length.
- If you change the channel or the input source in timeshift mode, a message prompts you to select Yes or No. You can select Yes to stop the timeshift function and execute the channel change or the input source change.

Using subtitles

You can enable subtitles for each TV channel. Subtitles are broadcast via Teletext or DVB-T/DVB-C digital broadcasts. With digital broadcasts, you have the additional option of selecting a preferred subtitle language.

Turning on/off subtitles

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Channel > Subtitle and press OK/

 >> to enter.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Enabling subtitle languages on digital TV channels

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Channel > Subtitle > Digital subtitle language and press OK/

 to enter.
- Press to select a subtitle language as your preferred language and press OK to confirm.
- 4. Press **<a>√** <a> to select a secondary subtitle language and press **OK** to confirm.
- 5. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Shortcut operation: Press **SUBTITLE** on the remote control to directly select a subtitle language available for the selected digital TV programme.

Selecting a subtitle type on digital TV channels

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Channel > Subtitle > Subtitle type and press OK/>> to enter.
- Press > to select a subtitle type and press
 K to confirm. You can select Hearing Impaired to display the hearing impaired subtitles with your selected language.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Using Teletext

Selecting decoding page language

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Channel > Teletext > Decoding page language and press OK/S to enter.
- Press to select a proper type of language in which Teletext will display and press OK to confirm
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Digital Teletext language

On digital TV channels, depending on the broadcaster, you may be able to enjoy a service with multiple initial Teletext pages in different languages. This function allows you to select an available language as primary language, which relates to different initial Teletext pages.

- Press to select a language and press OK to confirm.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

F-Manua

E-Manual is an electronic user manual for the product. You can find instructions for the features of this TV set.

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > E-Manual and press OK to enter.
- 3. Press EXIT to exit.

Time access

You can access the time from digital channels following the instructions below.

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > Timer > Clock > Auto synchronization and press OK/

 to enter.
- Press to select On and press OK to confirm.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Customising the input settings

You can name your connected sources according to the type of device instead of the type of socket.

- Press to select a connector your equipment is connected to and press OK/> to enter.
- Press > to select the type of device connected to this connector and press OK to confirm.
- 4. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

After configuring, the selected source name will be displayed after the name of the related connector in the source list when pressing **SOURCE** on the remote control or **OK** on the TV set.

Note: Not all models have OK button on the set.

Software update

Note: Do not switch off or unplug the TV until the upgrade is completed.

Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > Software update and press OK/>
to enter. You have the following options to update the software.

- By USB: Enables you to install a new version software from a USB stick. Insert the USB stick in which a new version software is stored into a USB socket of the set. Select By USB and press OK/

 to enter. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the process.
- By network: Enables you to download and install the latest version software from the Internet. Make sure to set up a wired or wireless network connection first then select By network and press OK/

 to enter. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the process.

Note: Keep successful network connection during upgrade.

 By channel: Enables you to install the latest version software if available from the broadcast. Select By channel and press OK/>
 to enter. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the process.

Changing to shop or home mode

- Press to select Home, Shop or Shop with demo and press OK to confirm.
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

 Note: According to the regulation of European
 Commission 2009/125/EC, in Home
 mode, TV will be put into standby mode
 automatically if there is no operation in
 4 hours. This feature can be deactivated in
 the System > Timer > Auto standby menu.

Common interface

Encrypted digital TV channels can be decoded with a common interface module and a card provided by a digital TV service operator.

The common interface module may enable several digital services, depending on the operator and services you choose (for example, pay TV). Contact your digital TV service operator for more information about services and terms.

Using the common interface module

WARNING: Switch off your TV before inserting a common interface module. Be sure to follow the instructions described below. Wrong insertion of a common interface module may damage both the module and your TV.

- Following the directions printed on the common interface module, gently insert the module into the common interface slot on the TV.
- 2. Push the module in as far as it will go.
- Turn on the TV and wait for the common interface function to be activated. This may take several minutes.

Note: Do not remove the common interface module from the slot. Removing the module will deactivate the digital services.

Accessing common interface services

After inserting and activating the common interface module, press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > Common Interface and press OK/ to enter.

This menu option is only available if the common interface module is correctly inserted and activated. On-screen applications and content are provided by your digital TV service operator.

DivX video

(* not available for some models)

This DivX Certified® device has passed rigorous testing to ensure it plays DivX® video.

To play purchased DivX movies, first register your device at vod.divx.com. Find your registration code in the DivX VOD section of your TV's **System** menu, as explained below.

Obtain your registration code:

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control.
- Select Settings > System > Advanced settings > DivX(R) registration.
- Press OK/ and your registration code will be displayed.

Go to vod.divx.com for more information on how to complete your registration.

Deregister your TV:

If you wish to deregister your TV,

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control.
- Select Settings > System > Advanced settings > DivX(R) deregistration.

DivX®, DivX Certified®, DivX Plus® HD and associated logos are trademarks of DivX, LLC and are used under license.

T-Link

Use this function to search for CEC devices connected to the HDMI sockets in your TV and enable one-touch play and one-touch standby between CEC devices.

Enabling or disabling T-Link

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > Advanced settings > T-Link and press OK/>
 to enter.
- Press to select On or Off and press OK to confirm
- 3. Press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.

Using one-touch play

With one-touch play, pressing the play button on (for example) your DVD remote control starts playback on your DVD device and automatically switches your TV to the correct source, displaying DVD content.

Using system standby

With system standby, pressing the \oplus button on (for example) your TV remote control switches your TV and all connected HDMI devices to standby mode.

Note: The CEC functions depend on the devices connected and it is possible that some devices may not interoperate correctly when connected to this TV. The user manual or the manufacturer of the problematic devices should be consulted for further information.

Reset shop

Allows you to reset the TV to factory default settings.

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > Reset shop and press OK/≫ to enter.
- 2. Use the numeric buttons to enter the password.
- 3. Press to select **OK** and press **OK** to confirm.
- **4.** The **Initial setup** menu appears. Follow the instructions in the section **Initial setup**.

Viewing pictures, playing music and watching videos from a USB storage device

Your TV is fitted with USB connectors that enable you to view pictures, listen to music or watch videos stored on USB drives.

Supported file formats:

Picture JPG/JPEG, BMP, PNG

Music MP3

Video AVI, MPG, MPEG, TS, DIVX, MKV,

HEVC...

Notes:

- Some USB keys and USB products like digital cameras or mobile phones are not fully compatible with USB standard so they may not work with the TV media player. Not all USB keys or devices are compatible with the USB function. Not all above formats are recognised. The encoding formats of your files will determine whether or not they can be played.
- Please use high speed (minimum 5MB/s read transfer) USB drives. To play back 4K content it is recommended to use 2.5" or 3.5" HDDs connected to the USB 3.0 port.

When a USB device is connected, press **MENU** on the remote control to display the homepage, press \sim to select **Media** and press **OK** to enter. Press < to select a USB drive in case you have inserted two or more USB drives and press **OK** to enter.

All Files

Use this function to display all supported files, if available.

- Press to select All Files, then press OK/ to enter the main file content browser.
- 2. In the main file content browser, use <
- **3.** Select an inner file folder, press **OK** to enter a sub file content browser.
- - Sort by: Sort folders and files by Name or Date.
 - Parser: You can select Recursive to display all supported files from all sub file folders.

- **DivX(R) Registration**: You can register or deregister this device.
- 5. Select a file and press OK to play.
- 6. Press to return to the previous interface.

Picture

Use this function to display pictures, if available.

- 3. Press **◊** to display the previous or the next picture, press **⋄** to show the playlist, and press **⋄** K to display the console.
- Press

 → to return to the previous interface.

Video

Use this function to watch videos, if available.

- Use > ISD to select a video in either main or sub file content browser, press OK to watch, and automatic playback begins from the selected video.
- Press OPTION to display the video menu in the browser mode. You can select different picture preset settings, play modes and screen modes, etc.
- **5.** Press **3** to return to the previous interface.

Music

Use this function to play back music, if available.

- Press to select Music, then press OK/\$ to enter the main file content browser.
- 3. Press to select different control buttons shown at the bottom of the TV screen and press OK to confirm. You can pause or play the song, select the previous or the next song, select different play modes, and show the playlist, etc. When you move the focus onto the progress bar, you can press
 >> to fast reverse or forward.
- 4. Press OPTION to display the music menu in the browser mode. You can select different sound preset settings, and show the music info if available, etc. You can also select Audio only to listen to the music with the screen turned off. Any key press will turn the screen on.
- **5.** Press **3** to return to the previous interface.

Using EPG (Electronic Programme Guide)

EPG is an on-screen guide that displays scheduled digital TV programmes. You can navigate, select, view and record programmes.

- 1. Press GUIDE on the remote control, the Program Guide menu will appear, which allows you to get information about the current or next programme playing on each channel. Navigate through the different programmes using the \(\subseteq \lambda \l
- Use the related buttons shown at the bottom of the screen to view EPG.
 - Prev day: Press ◀◀ to display EPG of the previous day.
 - Next day: Press ▶▶ to display EPG of the next day.
 - Filter: Programme guide filter for digital TV programmes.
 - Press OPTION to display the type list of the programme.

 - Select one or more types, which you want to highlight from the Type list, press OK to select or deselect. A checkmark will appear to the left of the type when selected. When you select a type, all its subtypes (if available) will be selected accordingly.
 - Also, you can select some desired subtypes (if available) without selecting any type first.
 - Press **OPTION** to exit the type list.
 - After filtering, all your desired digital TV programmes will be highlighted.
 - Schedule list: Press the yellow button to bring up the Schedule list menu.
 - · Press the red button to add a schedule.
 - Press the green button to delete a selected schedule
 - Press **OK** to edit a selected schedule.
 - Add schedule: Press the red button to add a schedule into your schedule list.
 - Channel number: use
 ✓> to select the desired channel.
 - Start date: use the numeric buttons to set the start date.
 - Start time: use the numeric buttons to set the start time.
 - End time: use the numeric buttons to set the end time.
 - Schedule type: use
 √> to select the available schedule type.
 - Select **Reminder** to be reminded that you can switch to the scheduled programme when the time you have set comes.

- Select Record (if available) if you want to start your scheduled recording when the time you have set comes. When time is out and you do not execute any operation, scheduled recording will start automatically.
- Repeat type: use **>** to select different repeat mode for the schedule.
- Press to select Add schedule, and press OK to confirm.
- 3. Press GUIDE or EXIT to exit EPG.

PVR (Personal Video Recorder)

Allows you to record your favourite TV programmes. Before you use the function, connect a USB drive to the set first.

- Note: This feature is available only in selected products and, due to specific TV network limitations and country technical requirements, might not be available in product or place of installation. This feature might also be blocked by TV network due to copyright protection (HD content, recording protection). Please press OPTION on the remote control to check if this feature is available in your product.
- Press OPTION on the remote control, select PVR and press OK to enter.
 - Shortcut operation: press the button on the remote control to enter PVR directly.
- **3.** During recording, PVR mini pane will be shown on the screen to indicate the recording progress.
- 4. Press the button to stop the recording manually. In normal operation, the recording will stop automatically when the recording duration has passed.
- 5. The record file is put into a folder named "PVR" on your USB drive. To watch the recorded programme, exit PVR mode first and enter Media from the homepage. Select PVR, then select the related record file and press OK to play.

Notes:

- This feature is available only for non encrypted digital channels. Even when CICAM (CI or CI+) is inserted, this feature is not available on encrypted channels.
- Before you connect the USB drive to the set, make sure you have backed up the data in the drive to avoid the loss of your important data due to unforeseen malfunction.
- The bigger the USB drive free memory for the PVR function, the bigger the recording length.

- If you want to change channel or input source during recording, store the recording data before changing the channel or input source.
- The set cannot play files normally if the parameters of the file exceed the limitations of the system, the file format is not supported, the file is damaged, or the file cannot be decoded.
- Do not disconnect the USB drive when the system is reading a file or transmitting data, otherwise the system or the drive may be damaged.

MHL (Mobile High-Definition Link)

(* not available for some models)

You can use the following functions by connecting the HDMI port identified with MHL on the TV and the USB port of an MHL compatible mobile phone or similar device with an MHL cable.

- · Charge your mobile phones from the TV.
- Two-way remote operation between TV and mobile phone.
- Video or audio output from your mobile phone. Notes:
 - These functions may not be available depending on the connected equipment.
 - If there is no more battery life left in the connected device, charging will not start.
 - To operate the mobile phone with the TV remote control, you need to turn on the T-Link function first, then press OPTION and select T-Link > Setup > Guide menu. Follow the virtual keypad to do operations.

Connecting MHL compatible device

- Connect the MHL compatible device to the HDMI port identified with MHL on the TV using an MHL cable (not supplied), charging will start automatically.
- When connecting an MHL compatible device to the HDMI port identified with MHL on the TV, switch the TV input source to the corresponding HDMI input. Note: Do not connect the MHL compatible device to any ports other than the HDMI port identified with MHI

When using MHL

- Interoperability with MHL devices from other manufacturers is not guaranteed.
- TCL does not provide any guarantee, therefore, against operational failure such as that described below when an MHL source is connected to the TV.
 - No picture or sound
 - Some of the functions do not work by remote operation from the TV
- If MHL does not work properly, also contact the manufacturer of the source device for advice on its use.
- Do not disconnect the power plug of the TV when the TV is active and the MHL device is connected.

 Do not disconnect the power plug of the TV when the TV is in standby mode and the MHL device is connected

MHEG function

Some digital TV broadcasters offer dedicated digital text or interactive services (for example, BBC1). These services work like normal Teletext with the addition of number, colour and navigation buttons.

Note: MHEG and subtitles are mutually exclusive and cannot coexist on the same screen. If Subtitle is set to On, MHEG will not appear. Please follow the instructions in the section Turning on/off subtitles to set Subtitle to Off.

- Press the red button or TEXT on the remote control.
- 2. Press $\langle | \langle | \langle | \rangle \rangle$ to select or highlight items.
- 3. Press **OK** to confirm or activate.
- 4. Press one of the colour buttons to select an option.
- 5. Press TEXT or EXIT to exit.

Network connection

You can set up your TV so that it can access the Internet through your local area network (LAN) using a wired or wireless connection.

Connecting to a wired network

You can connect your TV to your LAN using cable in three ways:

- You can connect your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on your TV to an external modem using a Cat 5 cable.
- You can connect your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on your TV to an IP sharer, which is connected to an external modem. Use Cat 5 cable for the connection.
- Depending on how your network is configured, you
 may be able to connect your TV to your LAN by
 connecting the LAN port on your TV directly to a
 network wall outlet using a Cat 5 cable. Note that
 the wall outlet is connected to a modem or router
 elsewhere in your house.
- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Network > Internet connection and press OK/

 to enter.
- Press to select On and press OK to confirm.
- Press to select Ethernet and press OK to confirm.
- Press \(\sigma \) to select IP settings and press
 OK/\(\sigma \) to enter. You can set Address type to Auto or Manual.
 - Select **Auto** if you want the TV to acquire and enter the needed IP address automatically.
 - Select Manual if you want to enter your IP address manually, then:
 - Press
 to go to the first entry field.
 - Enter the IP address, Subnet mask, Default gateway, Primary DNS and Secondary DNS values. Use the numeric buttons to enter numbers and the △◇/ຝ≫ buttons to move from one entry field to another.

Connecting to a wireless network

Your TV is equipped to be connected to your home network wirelessly. To do that you need a wireless router or modem

Note: This set can operate at dual 2.4GHz and 5GHz bands. For correct operation at 5GHz, set the 5GHz band channel (if available) of your wireless router to 36, 40, 44 or 48.

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Network > Internet connection and press OK/

 to enter.
- Press to select On and press OK to confirm.
- Press to select Interface and press OK/ to enter.
- Press to select Wireless and press OK to confirm.
- 5. Press settings and press OK/ to enter. You can set the wireless network connection in 3 ways:
 - a) Scan

 - Press

 to return to the Wireless settings menu.

Note: If you select a protected access point, you will have to enter the corresponding password. Press **OK** on the remote control to display the virtual keyboard to enable you to enter the password.

- b) Manual

Press \(\sigma \) to select Manual and press OK/\(\sigma \) to enter. You will be prompted to enter the correct SSID of an available wireless router to set up the connection. Press \(\sigma \) to return to the Wireless settings menu.

- c) Auto

If your AP (Access Point) supports WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup), you can connect to the network via PIN (Personal Identification Number) or PBC (Push Button Configuration). WPS will automatically configure the SSID and WPA key in either mode.

Press to select **Auto** and press **OK/** to enter.

- PIN: Select PIN and press OK/>
 to enter.

 Choose a random PIN code. Make sure
 this code is installed on the AP. (For the
 procedures, refer to your router manual.) Select
 OK and press OK to set up the connection.

the PBC push button on your router within 2 minutes before you select **OK** and press **OK** again. Your TV will automatically acquire all the network setting values it needs and connect to your network.

- Press

 to return to the Wireless settings menu.
- Press to return to the Network menu.
- 6. If you want to check the information on current connection, such as Interface, Address type, IP address, etc., press to select Information and press OK/>
 to enter. Press to return to the Network menu.
- If you want to check the Internet connectivity, press \(\sigma \rightarrow \rightarrow \rightarrow \text{ to select Connection test and press OK/\(\sigma \rightarrow \rightar

DLNA (Share & See)

Note: This manual covers products with either Share & See or DLNA function. Share & See is DLNA-compatible.

Connecting to your PC

Make sure to set up a wired or wireless connection from your TV to a router first. Then connect your PC to your router either through a network cable or wirelessly. Also make sure to select **Network > Internet connection** and select **On**, and that your computer firewall won't block the connection.

Enabling DLNA function

Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Network > DLNA and press OK/S to enter. Press <a>/> to select On and press OK to confirm. Follow the steps in turn specified hereafter, then you can enjoy recorded videos, images and music saved on your PC.

Adding media from your PC for sharing

Install a DLNA media server on your PC. The simple and familiar server you may install is Microsoft Windows Media Player 11 and 11 above. Follow the instructions below to allow your TV to access the designated files on your PC.

- 1. Open the Microsoft Windows Media Player 11.
- 2. Select Library > Media sharing.
- 3. Check the checkbox Share my media to.
- Select the icon of the TV set connected to your PC.
- Select Allow to allow the TV set to access your PC, and select OK to enable the access. Note: Use the Settings button to customize your desired settings.
- 6. Select Library > Add to Library.
- Select your personal folders or folders of other users that you can access for sharing.
- 8. Select Add and press OK to enable the addition.

DLNA application

Select **Media** from the homepage and press **OK** to enter. Then you can view pictures, listen to music or watch videos, which are stored on your PC.

Supported file formats:

Picture JPEG, PNG

Music MP3, WMA, LPCM Video MPEG2. MPEG4. WMV

Notes:

- If DLNA is switched on, the TV will display the list of available DLNA servers which are available in local network
- Content from third-party DLNA servers may not play correctly on your TV due to compatibility problems.
- When sharing media files from a PC, certain features may be unavailable and, due to the file and encoding formats used, playback issues may occur.
- Because of network related conditions, playback of media files may not be error-free. When this happens, play them from a USB drive.

GuideOn

GuideOn refers to network EPG, which is an app of preview programme and helps you navigate through a vast amount of content. It provides functionality similar to a printed programme guide by informing you as to which television content is available, such as cast and related information

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Network > GuideOn and press OK/

 to enter.
- Press > to select On and press OK to confirm, then press EXIT or MENU to close the menu.
- Press GUIDE on the remote control to display the network EPG page. It contains three tabs: On-Going, Guide and Reminders.
 - Press **⟨**/**>** to select a tab.
 - Press OK to enter.
- 4. To guit the EPG, press EXIT on the remote control.

Note: To use network EPG, make sure the Internet is connected. In case Internet is connected and GuideOn is turned on, network EPG replaces local EPG as described in section Using EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) when you press the GUIDE button.

TV Remote

This function allows you to turn a smart device into a sophisticated remote control, providing more features than your normal TV remote control. You can then control your TV through your smart device.

 Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Network > TV Remote and press OK to enter. You will see details for downloading the TV Remote application and other related information.

Note: The following instructions are based on the example of a laptop.

- Download and install into the laptop the correct TV Remote application for the laptop.
- Make sure the laptop and the TV are in the same home LAN (local area network) or network segment.
- Run the TV Remote application on the laptop, it will search and communicate with the TV automatically to enable the TV Remote functionality.
- 5. Once the TV and the laptop are linked as described in step 4, you will be able to enjoy the extra features of the TV Remote function.
- To quit the TV Remote function, press EXIT on the remote control.

WiFi TV link

(*not available for some models)

WiFi TV link allows you to share screen and sound of your device such as a smartphone or a tablet to your TV, wirelessly (i.e. without cables). This makes it possible to view on your TV, at the same time, what your smartphone or tablet is showing. For example, you can launch a video on your smartphone and display it simultaneously on your TV, or use your tablet as game controller with content displayed on the big screen of your TV.

Whenever you want to use WiFi TV link, you must first activate this function in your TV. To do it follow the steps below:

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > Network > WiFi TV link and press OK to enter. You will see details for this function.
- Find the WiFi TV link function in your device. Different devices may have different names for this function.
- Then click the "connection" function on the device. If connected successfully, you will see on your TV screen what the device is showing.

Note: TCL does not guarantee that the use of the WiFi TV link function will be smooth or errorfree since not all devices are compatible with the WiFi TV link function

HbbTV

HbbTV (Hybrid broadcast broadband TV) is a service offered by certain broadcasters and available only on some digital TV channels. HbbTV delivers interactive television over broadband Internet. These interactive features are added to and enrich the normal digital

programmes, and include services such as digital teletext, electronic programme guide, games, voting, specific information related to the current programme, interactive advertising, information magazines, catchup TV, etc.

To use HbbTV please ensure your TV is connected to Internet and HbbTV is switched on.

Notes:

- HbbTV services are broadcast- or countrydependent and may be unavailable in your area.
- You cannot download files to your TV with HbbTV function.
- Application provider or broadcasting related conditions may cause an HbbTV application to be unavailable momentarily.
- To access HbbTV applications you must connect your TV to the Internet via a broadband link.
 HbbTV applications may not work correctly in case of network related issues.

HbbTV access

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > HbbTV mode and press OK/>> to enter.
- Press \(\sigma \rightarrow \) to select On and press OK to confirm.
- 3. When you tune to a TV digital channel that offers HbbTV, this will be signalled to you by an onscreen indication (generally a red button, but other colour buttons may also be used). Press the indicated colour button to open the interactive pages.
- Use and the colour buttons to navigate through the HbbTV pages and press OK to confirm.

HbbTV deactivation

To avoid disturbances that may be caused by HbbTV broadcasting tests, you can turn off the HbbTV function:

- Press MENU or OPTION on the remote control, select Settings > System > HbbTV mode and press OK/>> to enter.
- Press to select Off and press OK to confirm.

Chapter 7 - Smart TV

Allows you to enjoy Internet Applications (Apps), specially adapted Internet websites for your TV. You can control the Apps with the TV remote control.

WARNING:

- Configure the network settings before using Smart TV applications.
- Slow responses and/or interruptions may occur, depending on your network conditions.
- If you experience a problem using an application, please contact the content provider.
- According to circumstances of the content provider, an application's updates or the application itself may be discontinued.
- Depending on your country's regulations, some applications may have limited service or not be supported.
- Changes in application content may be made without prior notice by the service provider.

Access Smart TV portal

- 1. Press MENU to display the homepage.
- 2. Press
 ⟨V|⟨√⟩ to select Smart TV and press
 OK to enter the Smart TV portal.

Shortcut operation: Press **SMART TV** on the remote control to access the Smart TV portal directly.

Note: Since the connection with Internet takes time, it's recommended that you wait a few minutes to use the Smart TV feature after activation of TV from standby.

Password in Parental Control

- The default password is 1234. You can change it to a new one.
- The super password is 0423. If you forget your code, enter the super password to override any existing codes.

Troubleshooting

Please check the following list before requesting service.

There is no picture or sound.

- Make sure the power cord is properly inserted in the power outlet.
- Make sure the source type is set correctly.
- · Make sure the antenna is properly connected.
- Make sure the volume is not set to minimum or the sound is not set to mute.
- · Make sure the headphones are not connected.
- The TV may be receiving a signal other than from TV broadcasting stations.

Picture is not clear.

- Make sure the antenna cable is properly connected.
- Consider whether your TV signal is being properly received
- Poor picture quality can occur due to a VHS camera, camcorder, or other peripheral being connected at the same time. Switch off one of the other peripherals.
- The 'ghost' or double image may be caused by obstruction to the antenna due to high-rise buildings or hills. Using a highly directional antenna may improve the picture quality.
- The horizontal dotted lines shown on the pictures may be caused by electrical interference, e.g., hair dryer, nearby neon lights, etc. Turn off or remove these.

Picture is too dark, too light or tinted.

- Check the colour adjustment.
- · Check the brightness setting.
- · Check the sharpness function.

Remote control does not work.

- · Check the batteries of the remote control.
- Make sure the remote sensor window on the TV front is not under strong fluorescent lighting.
- Try to clean the remote sensor window on the TV front with a soft cloth.
